Tom,

I am not opening the file you have sent today with the mechanical meter enclosure design files, as they remain the property of the USCL Corporation.

I was asked by my attorney Richard Bryson - in your words "at the time William Brownstein ESQ., was discussing the USCL financial situation with him" - whether I intended to manufacture a power meter, or whether I instead wished to have my money returned as stipulated by binding agreements of February and subsequently of April 2007 with USCL.

I elected the latter, upon which the legal proceedings that are since on record were initiated. I ultimately received a court settlement fully in my favor that has yet to be honored comprehensively by either the USCL Corporation or by you personally to the extent of your indemnity. I enclose three currently pending invoices with the charges that remain. I am also owed the redemption of bridge loan funds of 30,000 US dollars plus interest as required by the enclosed loan agreement of September 25, 2007.

In the enclosed Memorandum of Understanding of February 2, 2007, the USCL Corporation committed to use the sum of \$60,000 I had lent exclusively for expediting the production of the meter enclosure tooling. That was to be undertaken immediately. Note that the MOU specifies the necessity for all of these funds to be paid within five days. That provision can only be interpreted to have meant that the money was to be forwarded exclusively and entirely to the group of companies managed by BMP International in Raleigh, North Carolina, since no other purpose for the funds was stated or implied.

Six months later, therefore, the meter enclosure tooling should have already been produced and delivered for production purposes. I received no communication from USCL to the contrary. Yet I received neither the money due me nor the title to physical tooling that was to have been completed by that time, since my loan of \$60,000 had been already forwarded under your signed commitment per MOU of February 2007 to the BMP International companies.
